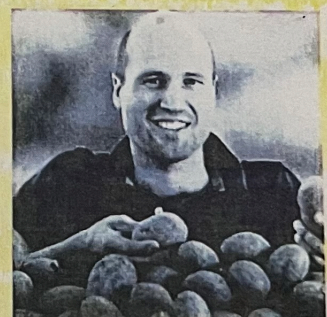
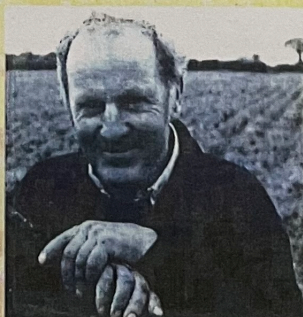
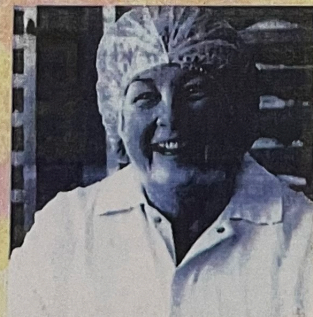


Traditional Steak Pasty or Cheese and Onion Pasty
